

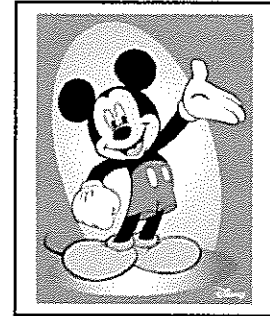

Incident Report – We had one accidental discharge that could have been worse. As it was, all that was needed was six stitches and a clean pair of underwear. One competitor was shooting a Baretta over under and the bottom barrell kept misfiring. He was attempting to pull the load when it went off in the range house. The rod went through the roof and its bent remains were later found in the parking lot. Even though the nipple was off and water had been put down the barrell, but somehow in the process the powder was dry and there was a spark or the powder was compressed while attempting to pull the load causing detonation. Frustration from malfunctioning guns during competition can certainly lead to lack of attention to detail. Just because we have been doing this for a long time we should not become complacent. Please be capable of learning from someone else's mistakes.

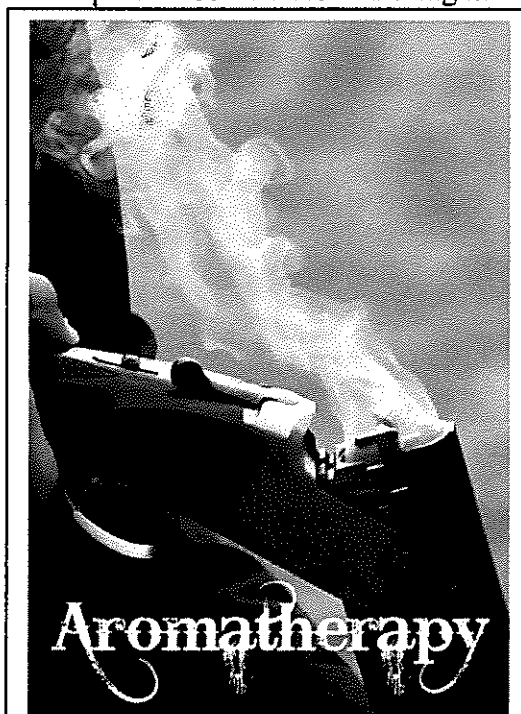
LIVER EATING JOHNSON GOES TO THE CIRCUS

SAFETY ALERT!

Learn from others and be prepared. At the shotgun shoot we had an incident of an unintentional discharge from the loading bench inside the range house. When we grabbed the first aid kit, it was only a skinned knee band aid kit, the items were expired, and the adhesive was dried out. Every range *must have an up to date first aid kit* and have items in it to handle a major injury. Take a look at what a military issue combat first aid kit has in it. While ranges do not need everything the military has, you will need a couple of compress bandages adequate for a possible gun shot wound. FYI you can use a box of Maxi Pads as compress bandages. They are wrapped up, sanitary, inexpensive, and designed to soak up blood. These and a roll of tape might just save a life. As an additional thought a kit like this should be in every vehicle. If you come across a car wreck the injuries certainly are more than a skinned knee.
